SPIRITUAL WARFARE - PRAYER

On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. ⁵We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ." Later, Abraham Lincoln in **1863** proclaimed a season of **pray and fasting during war between the states to cease**. Our Gwinnett Fallen Hero's Memorial list every name **(as you see in the above picture)** of all the soldiers who sacrificed their lives in the awful war between the states. Finally, in **1952** it was declared by President Truman **as an annual Day of Prayer**. Later in **1988** President Reagan set the date permanently on **the first Thursday of May**.
